Freemasonry's Presidential Lineage

Until 1971, both February 12 and February 22 were observed as federal holidays to honor the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln (February 12) and George Washington (February 22). In 1971 President Richard Nixon proclaimed one single federal holiday, Presidents' Day, honoring all past presidents of the United States of America to be observed on the third Monday of February. This year the date is February 18.

While many Masons know about the Masonic affiliation of Brother George Washington, thirteen other Presidents have also been Masons. These fourteen Masonic Presidents span the history of the United States from George Washington to Gerald Ford. February and Presidents' Day offer the opportunity for Masons to recognize the contributions of these Brothers to their country.

The fourteen Masonic Presidents are George Washington, James Monroe, Andrew Jackson, James K. Polk, James A. Buchanan, Andrew Johnson, James A. Garfield, William McKinley, Theodore Roosevelt, William H. Taft, Warren G. Harding, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry S. Truman, and Gerald R. Ford.

As Freemasonry has played a significant role in the history of the United States, it has influenced most or all of our Presidents.

Franklin D. Roosevelt said, "The more I come into contact with the work of the Masonic Fraternity, the more I am impressed by the great charitable work and the great practical good which we are carrying out."

George Washington described Masonry as being "founded in justice and benevolence" and wrote "the grand object of Masonry is to promote the happiness of the human race."

Many presidents have spoken of Freemasonry's good work on behalf of charity and helping others.

Have You Heard?

St. Bernards get their name from the Holy Saint Bernard of Montjou, the patron saint of the Alps, who founded a monastery between Italy and Switzerland. An alpine route, known as the Great St. Bernards Pass, was particularly treacherous because of the high incidence of snowstorms and avalanches. Monks frequently patrolled the area to rescue stranded travelers. Their dogs, cross-bred from Mastiffs, Great Danes, and Newfoundlands, were helpful because their broad chests cleared snow and their sense of direction was useful in heavy fog and snowstorms. It has been reported that the dogs have rescued 2,000 people over 200 years. There's no solid evidence to show that the dogs carried cognac to revive lost travelers, though historians cite a letter written by a Swiss citizen in 1816, which stated, "often the dogs carry a little barrel around their necks with alcoholic beverages." The birthstone for February is the Amethyst and symbolizes stability, peace, and sincerity. The flower is the Violet.






