Father's Day Traditions Around the World

The history of Father's Day is different in many countries; each has their own unique traditions to celebrate dads. From beer-filled carts to cakes and special prayers, Father's Day traditions are fun to learn about. You might even decide to adopt one or two of these traditions or realize they're not so different from how you celebrate.

Germany

Germany celebrates *Männertag* (Men's Day) on Ascension Day, a public holiday that falls 40 days after Easter. Young and old men may go for a hike before dragging a wagon full of beer through the town for an afternoon of drinking together. This tradition harks back to the Middle Ages when men were pulled in carts to the center of the village and celebrated. The man with the most children would receive a prize–usually a ham. Nowadays, many German men take the next day off from work to nurse their hangovers as this day rivals the amount of drinking that happens during Oktoberfest.

Costa Rica

Like many countries, Costa Rica celebrates Father's day on the third Sunday of June to adopt the U.S. custom of celebrating fathers. Children often make handmade gifts for their fathers. But the big event is a large family gathering with plenty of food. They may eat *gallo pinto* (rice and beans dish) or *casado* (meat, vegetables, and plantains) while children perform a skit or song and dance.

Italy

In Italy, *Festa del Papà* is celebrated on St. Joseph's feast day, which is March 19. In some areas, school-age children compose original poetry for their dad and create homemade cards or drawings. True to the Italian culture of gathering over meals, families celebrate with a big Italian meal, which might be meatless since it's Lent season.

Sweden

Most Swedes celebrate *Fars Dag* on the second Sunday in November. The tradition seems to have started at the turn of the 20th century. Fathers often receive cakes and presents, such as books or ties on this day, and the joke goes that older dads tend to have a lot of ties.

Fathers are honored in all sorts of ways on Father's Day in nearly every country of the world. On this special day, we honor our biological fathers and anyone who acted as a father figure in our lives. For some, an uncle, grandfather, or close family friend takes the place of a father. 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FLAG DAY - JULY 14 Facts About the U.S. Flag

1. Bernard Cigrand, a small-town Wisconsin teacher, originated the idea for an annual flag day, to be celebrated across the country every June 14, in 1885. That year, he led his school in the first formal observance of the holiday. Cigrand, who later changed careers and practiced dentistry in Illinois, continued to promote his concept and advocate respect for the flag throughout his life.

2. It is widely believed that <u>Betsy Ross</u>, who assisted the <u>Revolutionary War</u> effort by repairing uniforms and sewing tents, made the first American flag. However, there is no historical evidence that she contributed to Old Glory's creation. It was not until her grandson William Canby held an 1870 press conference to recount the story that the American public learned of her possible role. It has since been confirmed that Francis Hopkinson, a delegate from New Jersey who signed the Declaration of Independence, designed the American flag.

3. The lyrics of "The Star-Spangled Banner," America's national anthem since 1931, are taken from a patriotic poem written by <u>Francis Scott Key</u> after he witnessed the Battle of Fort McHenry during the <u>War of 1812</u>. His words were set to the tune of "To Anacreon in Heaven," a popular British drinking song.

4. In the 1950s, when it seemed certain that <u>Alaska would be admitted to the Union</u>, designers began retooling the American flag to add a 49th star to the existing 48. Meanwhile, a 17-year-old Ohio student named Bob Heft borrowed his mother's sewing machine, disassembled his family's 48-star flag and stitched on 50 stars in a proportional pattern. He handed in his creation to his history teacher for a class project, explaining that he expected Hawaii would soon achieve statehood as well. Heft also sent the flag to his congressman, Walter Moeller, who presented it to <u>President Eisenhower</u> after both new states joined the Union. Eisenhower selected Heft's design, and on July 4, 1960, the president and the high school student stood together as the 50-star flag was raised for the first time. Heft's teacher promptly changed his grade from a B- to an A.

5. The Flag Code stipulates that the Stars and Stripes should not be used as apparel, bedding or drapery.

6. The practice of draping coffins in the American flag is not reserved for military veterans and government officials. On the contrary, any burial may incorporate this tradition.

7. Ever wondered how to correctly fold an American flag? First, enlist a partner and stand facing each other, each holding both corners of one of the rectangle's shorter sides. Working together, lift the half of the flag that usually hangs on the bottom over the half that contains the blue field of stars. Next, fold the flag lengthwise a second time so that the stars are visible on the outside. Make a triangular fold at the striped end, bringing one corner up to meet the top edge. Continue to fold the flag in this manner until only a triangle of star-studded blue can be seen.



National Safety Month

Each June the National Safety Council spreads the word about keeping everyone safe from the workplace to anywhere. They choose different topics to highlight each year, **falls** being one topic this year.

You can make small changes to help prevent falls. More than 1 in 4 older adults fall each year. Falling can lead to broken bones, difficulty getting around and other problems, especially for those over the age of 65.


Here are some steps to take to lower your risk of falling:

- \cdot Talk to your doctor about falls and how to prevent them.
- \cdot Exercise to improve your balance and strength
- \cdot Review all medicines with your doctor or pharmacist– some can make you dizzy or sleepy, causing you to fall.
- \cdot Get your vision check by an eye doctor ever 1 to 2 years . Be sure to update your glasses or contact lenses when your vision changes.
- \cdot Make your home safer. Install grab bars in and outside your bathtub or shower and put railings on both sides of your stairs.
- \cdot Get enough sleep. Feeling restless can lead to falls.
- · Limit your alcohol intake
- \cdot Standup slowly
- \cdot Use assistive devices if you feel unsteady when walking.
- \cdot Be careful when walking on wet or icy surfaces
- · Wear appropriate shoes.

 \cdot Always tell your doctor if you have had a recent fall, regardless of whether or not you are currently in pain.




The Secret Book of Flora Lea by Patti Callahan Henry

The Summer We Ran by Audrey Ingram

Genre: Fiction

Release date: June 3, 2025

Plot: In the summer of 1996, Tess Murphy and Grant Alexander fell in love despite coming from different worlds, but a tragedy tore them apart. Now, 20 years later, they are both running for Governor of Virginia, and secrets from their past threaten their futures. As the campaign unfolds, they must confront what really happened that summer and whether their past will define their future.

With a Vengeance by Riley Sager

Genre: Thriller

Release date: June 10, 2025

Plot: In 1954, Anna Matheson boards a luxury train with six people responsible for her family's ruin. She plans to expose their crimes and see them arrested when the train arrives in Chicago the next day. But when one of them is murdered, it becomes clear someone else is out for revenge. A Most Puzzling Murder by Bianca Marais

Genre: Not So Cozy Mystery

Release date: June 10, 2025

Plot: How do you solve a murder that hasn't happened yet? Destiny Whip is a former child prodigy, world-renowned enigmatologist and very, very alone. A life filled with loss has made her a recluse, an existence she's content to endure until a letter arrives inviting her to interview for the position of Scruffmore family historian. 
