National Virginia Day

In 2017, National Day calendar began celebrating each state in the order they entered the union. Virginia is celebrated on September 14th. This is a day to honor our great state and all of its history.

Interesting facts about Virginia:

- Virginia has produced eight US Presidents, more than any other state.
- Virginia is a leader in the Eco-friendly movement. Earth day was established in Virginia. Virginia Department of Forestry reports that 62 percent of the Commonwealth is forested.
- Petersburg's Pocahontas Island is the oldest free black community in the nation and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
- America's first woman-run bank was established in Richmond, VA by Maggie Lena Walker, a black woman.
- A distinct English dialect can only be found on Tangier Island, located in Virginia's Chesapeake Bay.
- Virginia is the largest seafood producer on the East Coast and the third largest in the country. A large part of that industry is due to Virginia Oysters, with eight distinct oyster regions in the Chesapeake Bay.
- Bourbon's roots originated in Virginia. Fayette County was in Southwest Virginia, but in 1792, county lines were redrawn and the area became part of the new state of Kentucky.
- Almost half of all Civil War battles were fought on Virginia soil.
- Naval Station Norfolk is the largest US navy base.
- Virginia contains 544 miles of the Appalachian Trail, more than any other state. The most photographed spot on the trail is McAfee Knob, located in Catawba, VA.
- Mountain Dew, the soft drink, was created in the Virginia mountains.

Lee Child

James Dover Grant was born in Coventry, England in 1954.He went to the same high school attended by J R R Tolkien. While attending law school, he worked part time in theatre. Instead of practicing law he joined Grenada Television and spent the next 18 years as a presentation director. Corporate restructuring left him unemployed at age 40. He saw this as an opportunity and invested \$6 in paper and pencils and decided to write a novel. He has since written 27 novels in a series in which the main character is called Jack Reacher. Where did he get the name? Grant is tall and when he grocery shopped with his wife she called him her Reacher. He has won many awards for his novels which appear under his pen name: Lee Child. Several were co-written with his brother Andrew, who also uses the pen name of Child.

Make Me opens with men burying a man named Keever with a back hoe in a hog lot on a wheat farm. They hear the train whistle for its stop in Mothers Rest in the middle of wheat fields somewhere between Oklahoma City and Chicago.

Jack Reacher, a former military policeman, steps off the train wondering why the place was named Mothers Rest. Reacher carries no bags and has no home. He goes where his interests lead him and buys new clothes when he feels dirty. As he is looking around, a tall oriental woman rushes onto the platform heading toward him. She asks him if he is Keever. He tells her no and heads off to explore the town after which he takes a room in the only motel

There is a diner close to the motel where Reacher decides to get some supper. The woman from the train station comes in and sits next to him. He inquires about the man she was meeting at the train. The woman, Michelle Chang, tells him she is a private investigator and worked for a firm with several offices around the country. Keever, who worked out of Oklahoma City, had called her and asked for her help and arranged to meet her in Mothers Rest, but hadn't shown up.

Reacher eventually offers to help her find Keever and the first half of the book has them flying around the country following leads and looking for people who know people who know something. The second half of the book gets into a part of the internet known as the Deep Web.

This book contained a lot of repetition. Both Reacher and Chang commit murder. There are pages that have nothing to do with the story, and overall it wasn't a great read by any means.
